We focus not only on the physical gains but also the chance to improve your






BSP - Blending of the Senses



Bridgwater Blake Museum



From Stone Age to Modern Age, there's something for everyone. Blake Museum is a 16th century house located in the heart of Bridgwater, a historic market town and port, first mentioned as Brugie in the Domesday Book of 1086. The Museum was first opened to the public in 1926 and it is said that Robert Blake, the town's most famous citizen, was born in the house in 1598. With the collections covering Bridgwater and the surrounding areas, we have fascinating displays waiting for you to discover.
