The Bridgwater Quayside Festival is a free family-friendly annual festival of live music, street theatre, dance, circus, sports, games, stalls, arts, and family activities. The festival takes place every year during the second weekend in July. There's something for everyone to enjoy. Jam packed with arts and culture all around Bridgwater.

We have a fabulous line up of bands and musicians in the town centre on the Cornhill music stage with RSVP Bhangra, The Kahunas, The Clashnikovs and Seed Sedgemoor in the High St with the Tent of Wonders and Bridgwater-based community

group of musicians who are behind the Clashmob an annual Clash pop-up performance. The town centre will be closed to traffic and there will be an array of stalls and performances in the town.

Bring a picnic to Blake Gardens. See the fabulous shows from Cirque De Silks, Angie Mack, and Ben Cornish. Enjoy listening to Claude Sandiford, Jon Maybey, Streetlinkz and The Roller DisGoat DJ's. Take part with Bowlore medieval sword school and the Green Top circus skills workshops. Watch local dancers. Take part in free festival Create and Make workshops and take something home with you.

Visit the Bridgwater Art Centre and take part in art tours, craft fair, indoor and outdoor exhibition, willow crafts along West Quay and the Beach'd Buoys Sea Shanty singers.

Visit The Engine Room in Clare St and meet the giant inflatable monster Berzerker, record your own unique growl at the library and join in. Bridgwater Blake Museum, Town Hall and Brick and Tile Museum are open. And there will be stalls and activities in Blake Gardens and in and around the town centre. Join in free workshops at Bridgy Gallery and visit the Town Hall with music and relax awhile in between shows and attractions.

Artists and young people in Bridgwater have been busy creating artwork to display in the eco arts festival trail, inspired by Bridgwater College Academy Eco podcasts of young people's voices sharing their vision of the future. There will also be a youth dance "River" highlighting themes, inspired by the River Parrett from its source in the Thorney Mills springs to the estuary.



Bridgwater Blake Museum



From Stone Age to Modern Age, there's something for everyone.

Blake Museum is a 16th century house located in the heart of Bridgwater, a historic market town and port, first mentioned as Brugie in the Domesday Book of 1086. The Museum was first opened to the public in 1926 and it is said that Robert Blake, the town's most famous citizen, was born in the house in 1598. With the collections covering Bridgwater and the surrounding areas, we have fascinating displays waiting for you to discover.

Meet Bowlore medieval knights of the round table Watch a hands-on armour display, listen to talks on medieval battle-medicine plus ad-hoc Q&As. watch displays of quaterstaffs and swords. and the popular sword-school, suitable for all ages. Sword-school is with soft 'boffer' swords.


